

SSOP Power Week 2025: International dental expertise comes together in Zurich

Practice-oriented continuing education inspires participants from three nations

Under the motto “5 days – 3 nations – 1 goal,” the renowned “Power Week 4 in 1 – Dental Expert Training” event organized by SSOP took place in Zurich from October 6 to 10, 2025. The innovative training format attracted dentists and dental technicians from Norway, Australia, and Poland to Switzerland to take their expertise to a new level under the guidance of experienced SSOP teachers Ron Scholte and Sabine von Sinner.

Once again, SSOP set new standards in dental training with Power Week: four specialized courses were bundled into just five days. Theory and practice, basics and expert knowledge, as well as textbook knowledge and laboratory experience were combined in a compact, sustainable learning format.

The first day was dedicated to the clinical fundamentals of total prosthetics. The focus was on anatomical impressions, registration, chewing stability, and the position and stability of the prosthesis—essential components for reproducible treatment success.

On the second day, the focus was on the technical processes behind high-quality dental prostheses. Participants analyzed workflows, materials, and precise technical steps to combine their theoretical knowledge with practical understanding.

The GERBER concept was the focus of the following 1.5 days. After a detailed model analysis, the front and side teeth were built up in wax to optimally combine function and aesthetics. A special highlight was the traditional surprise trip on the afternoon of the third day: at the House of Läderach in Bilten, participants immersed themselves in the world of Swiss chocolate – from cocoa beans to liquid chocolate. The day ended at Lake Zurich with inspiring conversations and a magnificent view.

The fifth and final day of the course was dedicated entirely to materials processing and refinement. From embedding with silicone cuffs to model isolation and conditioning of artificial teeth to the final finish and static and dynamic occlusion – precision, systematic approach, and tactile sensitivity characterized this conclusion.

“The intensive week was well worth it,” summed up a newly qualified expert in total prosthetics.

Conclusion: SSOP Power Week 2025 once again proved itself to be a practice-oriented training course of the highest standard. The international exchange, intensive learning phases, and personal encounters made the week an unforgettable experience.
